Ms. Armstrong is passionate about supporting and enabling women to pursue their own, unique leadership journey. In 2013, she was a founding member of the Women in Leadership (WIL) Initiative within the Government of Alberta. WIL is an employee driven movement aimed at supporting, engaging, and empowering each woman within the Government of Alberta to reach her full potential. Ms. Armstrong has spoken and written about her values based leadership style that emphasizes courage, humility, authenticity and resilience and through this work she encourages others to find their own leadership voice and create transformational change.

Ms. Armstrong was appointed Deputy Attorney General in October, 2013 and to the additional role of Acting Deputy Minister, Justice and Solicitor General in March, 2015. As Deputy Attorney General, she was responsible for the Legal Services Division and Crown Prosecution Service Division. In her role as Acting Deputy Minister, she oversaw a department of 6800 employees ranging from Crown prosecutors to correctional officers, and from court administration staff to Sheriffs. Ms. Armstrong was appointed Deputy Minister of Status of Women on June 30, 2015, followed by her most recent appointment in May, 2017 to Deputy Minister of Seniors and Housing.
